

Regarding the Environmental & Social Report 2005

Kanto Automobile Corporation has published an environmental report each year since FY2000 to disclose information on its environmental and other activities. In FY2004, the title of the report was changed to the Environmental & Social Report to reflect the expanded content. This FY2005 edition, prepared with due consideration to the Japanese Ministry of the Environment's Environmental Reporting Guidelines (2003 version), covers Kanto Automobile's environmental activities on an unconsolidated basis in FY2004 and in some areas reports on the status of the company's environmental management system, including at consolidated subsidiaries. It also provides information concerning social and economic aspects of the company's activities.

Kanto Automobile will continue its efforts towards realizing sustainable corporate management and further enhancing the content of the Environmental & Social Report.

This report covers mainly Kanto Automobile's environmental activities on an unconsolidated basis during FY2004 (April 2004 to March 2005), but also includes some information pertaining to FY2005.
